What You Need to Know About Counterfeit Pills and Fentanyl



KNOW THE FACTS

- Fentanyl is a powerful synthetic opioid that is similar to morphine but is 100 times more potent.
 Counterfeit opioids, specifically fentanyl, are now the most common drug involved in drug overdose deaths not only in the United States but, more specifically, in Arizona.
- Illicit fentanyl is most commonly sold as a powder or made to look like prescription pills, such as Oxycodone and Xanax.
- According to the Drug Enforcement Administration
 (DEA), 2 milligrams of fentanyl is considered a
 potentially lethal dose. That amount is similar to a few
 grains of salt. A tiny amount can be deadly.
- SIGNS OF AN OVERDOSE: pinpoint pupils, loss of consciousness, slow or weak breathing, cold and/or clammy skin, and a limp or weak body.

DATA TRENDS

- In 2024, there were 3,979 verified non-fatal opioid overdoses in Arizona. Of those non-fatal overdoses, 2,853 involved fentanyl. (azdhs.gov)
- In 2024, there were 1,367 fatal overdoses. Of those fatal overdoses, 73 were in the age range 0-24. (azdhs.gov)
- Laboratory testing indicates 5 out of every 10 pills seized by DEA contain a deadly dose of fentanyl. (dea.gov)
