What is the Governor's Youth Commission?

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Governor's Youth Commission (GYC) is to mobilize youth to be informed on the greatest challenges facing Arizona and to implement service projects that impact their communities across the state.

MEMBERS

The GYC is a diverse body of Arizona's high school sophomores, juniors and seniors serving for the 2020-21 school year. The GYC is composed of members from all of Arizona's fifteen counties.

MEETINGS

The GYC has four required meetings each term. These meetings are on Saturdays from 9 AM - 2 PM in Phoenix. There are also group phone calls five times a term on Wednesdays at 6 PM. Teens learn how to serve on a board, participate in committees, plan service projects and events and become leaders in their communities. Each year the group works on areas of focus such as, substance abuse prevention, education, human trafficking prevention, teen dating violence prevention and distracted driving prevention alongside other youth challenges where they can have an impact.

TERMS OF TENURE

GYC members may serve up to 2 years, with a recommitment form to complete after the first year. Re-appointment will be determined by participation and conduct, and is at the discretion of the Governor's Office of Youth, Faith and Family (GOYFF).

AGREEMENTS OF MEMBERSHIP

Being a commissioner requires a high degree of commitment. Before applying, please make sure that you are able to dedicate a sufficient amount of time to the GYC.

COMMISSIONER REQUIREMENTS

- Attend four in-person meetings a year, must arrive on time and be prepared.
- Participate in five conference calls per year, as well as one call per month for their committees.
- Actively participate in one sub-committee.
- Serve as a positive role model and adhere to a high code of conduct.
- Encourage and inspire other youth to serve.
- Enjoy networking and collaboration.
- Be a great listener, taking everyone's opinions into consideration.
- Conduct themselves professionally at all meetings, events, and on all social media.
- Take initiative in coordinating activities and leading community volunteer projects.
- Advance the work of GYC in coordination with GOYFF staff.
- Wear appropriate GYC attire when asked, a GYC polo will be provided to you.
- Follow curfew if and when overnight accommodations are provided.
- Ensure required forms on file with the GOYFF are current.
- Provide for their own transportation to all GYC meetings and events.
- This is a non-partisan position, but you must be able to represent the office of the Governor in a positive way at all times.

Application Process

The GYC recruitment process consists of an application and interview. All youth who are eligible to apply must meet the application requirements. The interview will either be in person at the Capitol, or, for those unable to travel, via video conference.

When appointed, the GYC Orientation for all members is scheduled for August 15, 2020. **Attendance for this meeting is mandatory.**
