#### 26-106-Anti-human trafficking grant fund

The anti-human trafficking grant fund is established consisting of monies appropriated by the legislature. Monies in the fund are continuously appropriated. The Department of Emergency and Military Affairs (DEMA) shall administer the fund and distribute monies from the fund to programs to reduce human trafficking in this state. To be eligible for grant monies, an anti-human trafficking program shall do either of the following:

- 1. Work to reduce human trafficking by providing assistance and analytical services to law enforcement agencies.
- Provide services to victims and training to law enforcement agencies, prosecutorial agencies, and the public on preventing and identifying human trafficking.




- Anti-human trafficking grant from legislation Total one-time cost: \$2,000,000
- Four electronic billboards strategically placed along valley highways for the month surrounding the Super Bowl Total one-time cost: **\$9.600**
- Public awareness <u>post</u> Super Bowl Total one-time cost: <u>\$200,000</u>
  - ASU STIR has begun marketing (both English & Spanish) the tipline around the state to include native communities and agencies serving human trafficking survivors
- Partner with Arizona State University Office of Sex Trafficking Intervention Research (ASU STIR) for Human Trafficking Victim
   Crisis Assistance and Support:
  - Total budget for five years: \$1,346,760












ASU STIR HT Victim Crisis Assistance & Support go-live date = February 1, 2023
