


ARIZONA BY THE NUMBERS:

TOTAL VALUE OF THAT UNPAID CARE IS \$9,559,000,000.






WHO ARE THE CAREGIVERS?



- TWO-THIRDS ARE WOMEN; ONE-THIRD ARE DAUGHTERS
- ONE IN THREE CAREGIVERS ARE 65+
- OVER HALF OF PRIMARY CAREGIVERS TAKE CARE OF THEIR PARENTS
- 25% OF DEMENTIA CAREGIVERS TAKE CARE OF AN AGING PARENTAND A CHILD
- 41% OF CAREGIVERS HAVE A HOUSEHOLD INCOME OF <\$50,000

BY 2050 TO MEET THE DEMAND.






COSTLY CONDITION

ALZHEIMER'S IS ONE OF THE COSTLIEST CONDITIONS TO SOCIETY AND THE U.S. ECONOMY.



NEARLY 10% OF ARIZONA DEMENTIA CAREGIVERS ARE IN POOR HEALTH THEMSELVES.





SLOW & BURDENSOME PROGRESSION

- PEOPLE AGE 65+ SURVIVE AN AVERAGE OF FOUR TO EIGHT YEARS AFTER A DIAGNOSIS, YET SOME LIVE AS LONG AS 20 YEARS.
- INDIVIDUALS WHO LIVE FROM AGE 70 TO 80 WITH ALZHEIMER'S SPEND 40% OF THIS TIME IN ALZHEIMER'S MOST SEVERE STAGE.
