

About Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation

Background

- In 1984 Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation ("AFFCF") was founded by 4 members of the Foster Care Review Board. Those of prominence include David Byers and Barbara Polk.
- AFFCF is a private foundation dedicated to impactful programming. 87 cents of every dollar goes toward our programs. AFFCF also works closely with government and community partners to engage viewpoints on key issues that will impact the children in foster care.
- Our founders were compelled to form an organization to help address the persistent and wide gap in funding given their direct experience. AFFCF has evolved over the years to focus on changing the outcomes of those that experience foster care.
- Today, AFFCF has three core impact areas. We serve approximately 40-50% (~5,000 – 6,000 children) of the total system across the State of Arizona.
- Our three impact areas are:
 - Childhood & Normalcy Funding (Serves ages 0-20)
 - Post-Secondary Education (Serves ages 18- 26)
 - Keys to Success (Serves ages 16-26)

Keys to Success Impact Evaluation Executive Summary

In summer 2023, Morrison Institute conducted a survey (n = 108) and focus group (n = 4) with Keys to Success participants to explore the outcomes and impacts of the program. Morrison Institute also analyzed administrative data tracking Keys to Success performance outcomes. The findings below provide evidence of the meaningful impacts of Keys to Success on youth transitioning out of the foster care system.

Since 2017, Keys to Success has **graduated over 850 youth**. According to program data, all target performance outcomes were exceeded.

88% of youth secured employment within 1 year [target = 80%]

86% of youth retained employment for 30+ days within 1 year [target = 75%]

86% of youth gained a skill or aptitude within 6 months of enrollment [target = 70%]

80% of youth enrolled in post-secondary education or vocational training, or established an industry-specific career pathway within 6 months of enrollment [target = 65%]

76% of youth increased their Self Sufficiency Matrix score by 3+ points within 1 year [target = 65%]

In particular, survey participants said **Keys to Success** made them better at...

Participants cited supportive staff, job support, and financial education as the most helpful program components. They also said that education support, goal setting, job support, and general help and support contributed most to their success. In addition, participants commonly noted the valuable relationship established with their caseworker/specialist who served as a trusted adult they could rely on.

...the person I have right now, she's very helpful...let's say I need something, like, she'll be like right there and say, 'Alright we got it.' And then I'll have it within a couple weeks of that. They're always helpful, even if I need to talk to somebody. They're still there to talk to.

91% of survey participants would recommend Keys to Success

of survey participants felt their needs were met by Keys to Success.

A majority of participants indicated that the program met their needs and that they would recommend Keys to Success to others. Overall, participants consistently highlighted the benefits of participating in the program and how it has helped them achieve their life goals. Findings show that participants found great value in the program – they appreciated the financial, logistic, and practical support and guidance as well as the unique relationship with their specialist who empowered them toward a successful future.
