Regionalized Detention Centers

- Chief Justice delegated regionalization task force to examine potential uses of unused detention space due to reduced numbers
- Six counties closed their detention center
- Pinal County became the regional center
- Fiscal savings to the county
- Programming developed in unused space

Repurposed Detention Space

Programming developed to address youth needs at the front end of juvenile justice, taking referrals from law enforcement, schools, families

Services include: 23-hour respite, counseling, tutoring and other resources for youth and families

Benefits:

- Provides safe place to assess needs and refer to services
- Reduces reliance on detention and helps to prevent deeper juvenile justice involvement
- Redirects detention costs to programs that target needs of community

Apache, Coconino, Pima and Yavapai counties presented successful programs to AJJC; additional similar programs present throughout the state

Centers supported by the community, schools, parents, and law enforcement

National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS)

- Prohibited Possessor Arizona State Law
- Statutory requirement restricts juveniles, with felony adjudications, from purchasing a firearm unless gun rights restored
- Juvenile Data sent to NICS upon their 18th birthday if not restored
- Reporting began 7-11-2021
- Juvenile requires application to court of jurisdiction to have rights restored
- When rights are restored, data is removed from NICS

Validated Risk Assessments

Detention Screening Instrument (DSI)

 Detention tool; assesses risk level immediately following arrest until appearing before a judicial officer. The tool assess risk to reoffend and failure to appear in court; currently, the second validation is underway, including a review of disparity within the tool

Arizona Youth Assessment Survey (AZYAS)

 Assess risk for juveniles post-disposition, on probation; youth reassessed every 6 months or significant life event

Disposition Matrix

 Probation tool; provides officers with recommended disposition consequences based on risk level and offense severity

Minor Victims of Sex Trafficking Screening Tool

• Used at any contact point in system to determine indicators of victimization

Minor Victims of Sex Trafficking

- Partnered with ASU to train all probation, detention and court
- Sex trafficking specialists designated in each probation department
- ASU screening tool utilized by specialists to identify victims
- Collaboratives expanding across state for coordinated responses to address victim needs
- Data collected in CMS of probation statewide
- Specialists partner with LE, local advocacy centers, DCS, AHCCCS and each other


