

Dana Suskind, MD, is founder and codirector of the TMW Center for Early Learning + Public Health. As a surgeon, social scientist, and leading authority on the role parents and caregivers play in promoting children's healthy brain development, Dr. Suskind promotes the critical importance of early language exposure on the developing child. She and her team design and deliver rigorously evaluated cutting-edge programs that help parents and caregivers harness the power of language to build children's brains and shape their futures.

Dr. Suskind is a member of the American Academic of Pediatrics and a Fellow of the Council on Early Childhood. She is the author of over 50 scientific publications, including the "empowering" and "beautifully written" *Thirty Million Words: Building a Child's Brain* and *Parent Nation: Unlocking Every Child's Potential, Fulfilling Society's Promise.* Her work has been profiled by numerous media outlets, including The New York Times, The Economist, Forbes, NPR, and Freakonomics.


