

LGBTQ people are at both heightened health and economic risk of COVID-19 LGBTQ+ people are more likely to work jobs in highly affected industries, often with more exposure and/or higher economic sensitivity to the COVID-19 crisis.

LGBTQ+ people are less likely to have health coverage.

 LGBTQ+ people are more likely to smoke and have chronic illnesses like asthma that can significantly increase complications during infection.
