




Cooperative Extension is a **statewide network** of knowledgeable faculty and staff that provides lifelong educational programs for all Arizonans.

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2019-2020 Results

78 members in 34 UACE programs gave 36,264 service hours in 12 counties & 3 tribal communities

28,941 Youth Received STEM based programming

Members supported 2,255 volunteers who provided 8,873 volunteer hours (2018-2019 – 1,632 member supported volunteer provided 14,223 volunteer hours)
