State Appropriation through DEMA to fight Human Trafficking

- \$500,000 State Appropriation
 - 2 Full Time Human Trafficking Detectives paid at 75%
 - Vehicles and equipment
 - Conference training nationwide for both detectives and their supervisor
 - 3 years of partial funding for the Arizona Human Trafficking Summit
 - Jail screening program and training for Detention Officers
 - Funding for YC MDT
 - OT Funds for YCSO and their LE Partners for buyer stings

- 2 Full Time HT Detectives
 - Only full time HT Detectives in Yavapai County
 - Responsible for organizing buyer stings and organizing partners
 - Following up on leads to the nationwide or state hotline
 - Investigating to locate victims
 - Speak in the community
 - Assisting agencies with HT investigations

- Arizona Human Trafficking Summit
 - \$12,000 per year for 3 years
 - 2023 saw over 300 people in attendance despite short registration period
 - 2024 planning for 500 attendees
 - 2023 3 distinct tracks along with general training
 - 2024 adding an educator track to existing LE, Advocate and Juvenile Probation
 - Preliminary plans for 1,000 attendees for 2025 Summit

- Detention Training
 - Develop and implement screening program for HT risk of victimization on intake
 - Develop training for Detention Officers to recognize and act on indicators of outside attempts to victimize inmates

- Yavapai County MDT to fight Human Trafficking
 - Funds are available to spend on MDT training, etc for MDT meetings
 - Using funds to provide quality training and expand the Disciplines and geographic locations of attendees

- Overtime funds provided for YCSO to manage
 - Funds to be used to offset OT costs for YCSO and other LE agencies to conduct buyer stings
 - Funds to pay "models" for undercover stings
